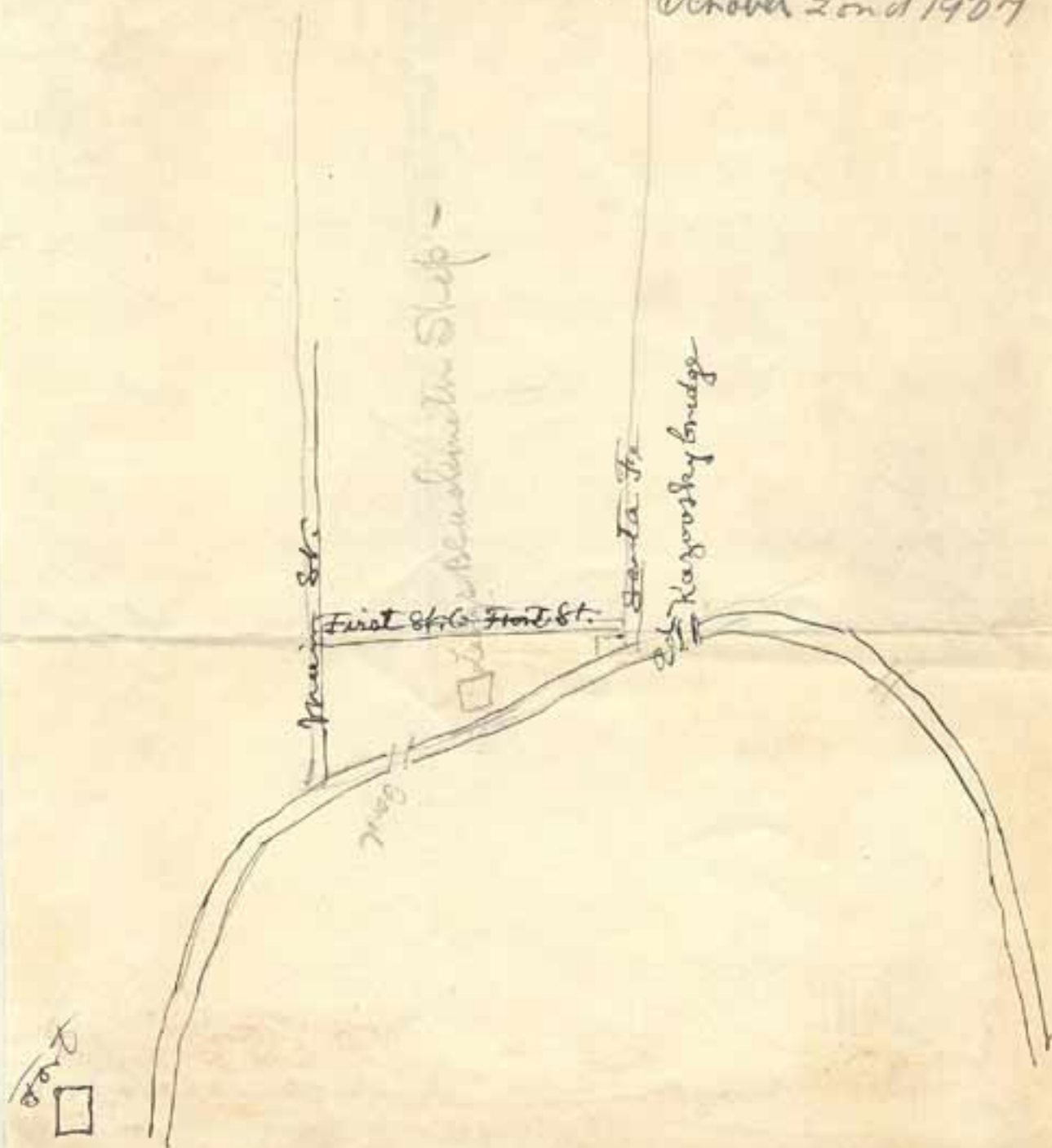

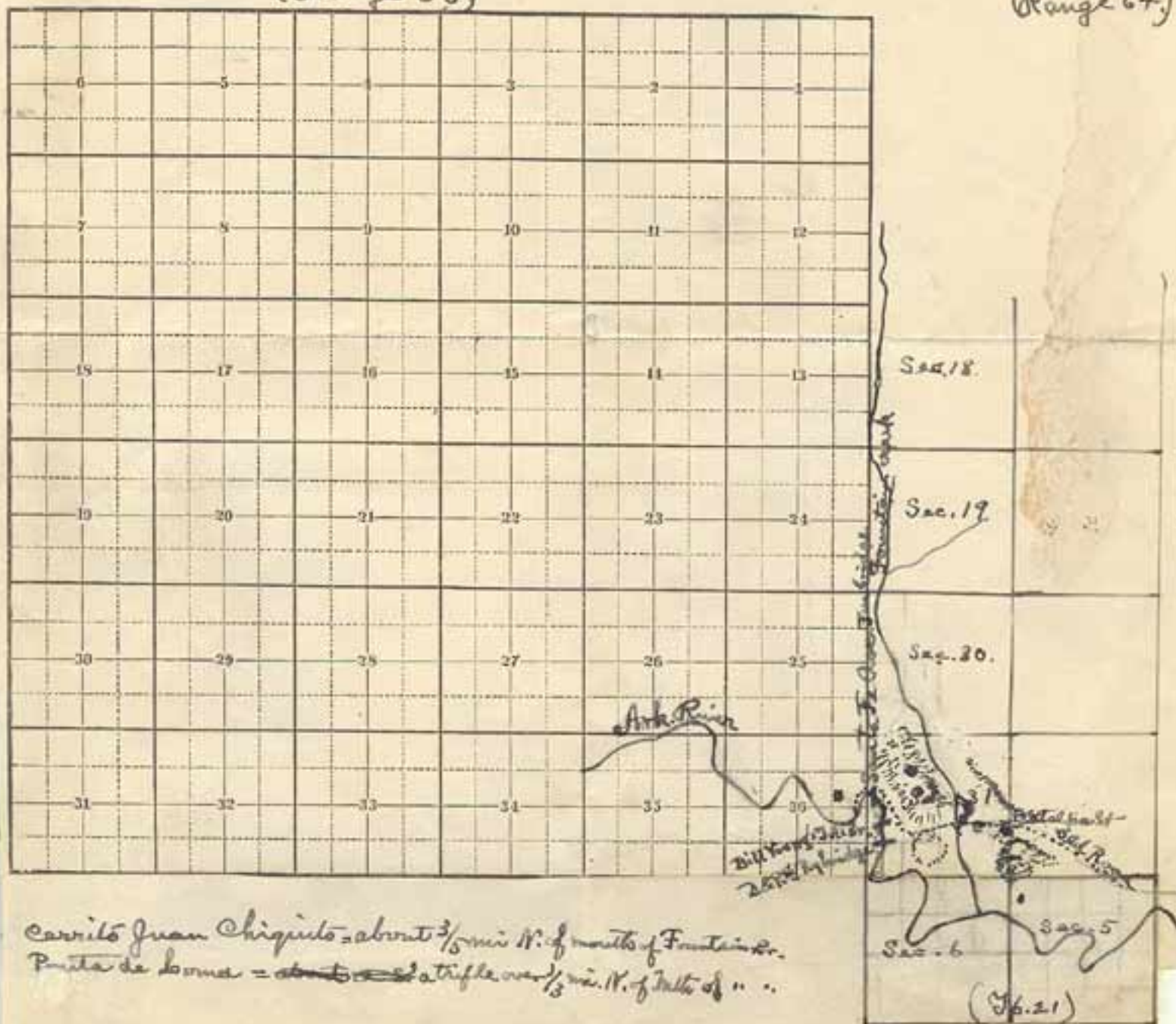
Early Local

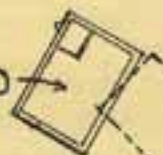
